Benefits of Music Education

In their document *Voices in the Arts*, the former president of the College Board, Gaston Caperton, states that the study of music, drama, dance and the visual arts help excite and reinforce learning in the subjects beyond the arts, like math, English, and science. He also writes that the arts help teachers reach students across a broad spectrum of learning styles and raise achievement in at-risk students, young children, underserved populations, and students with disabilities. TMEA data shows that schools with higher student involvement in fine arts had better student attendance and drop-out records. In addition, students selected as Texas All-State musicians have SAT scores over 400 points higher than the state average and over 350 points higher than the national average.
