Many believe that being in a school band, orchestra, or choir is an extracurricular activity, yet these are standards-based academic courses for which students receive course credits. State law requires every high school student to have at least one fine arts credit to graduate. However, student enrollment in high school and middle school music courses has been steadily declining for the past 10 years and, in elementary grades, music education is often sacrificed to prepare for TAKS tests.
